KEYS TO A ZOOPER FIELD TRIP

Thank you for registering for a field trip at the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium. Please review this packet as it contains important information for planning a successful field trip.

BEFORE YOUR FIELD TRIP:

- Plan to dress for the weather. Be aware that the zoo can sometimes be 10 degrees cooler than the city of Columbus.
- Encourage your students to wear your school colors! It is very helpful to chaperones and Zoo staff if students wear the same color. Fill out the Chaperone Form on page 7 and make copies for all adults attending the trip.

 lines.

ON THE DAY OF YOUR FIELD TRIP, BEFORE **DEPARTING YOUR SCHOOL:**

- Take an accurate headcount of all members of your group. Pass out nametags, schedules, or worksheets before you leave your school.
- If you are a large group, organize your students before boarding the bus. If your students are assigned to specific chaperones, have them sit together on the bus.
- Remind students of expected behavior during the trip, including staying with their assigned chaperone, respecting the animals, and following Zoo guidelines.
- Please bring your printed ticket barcodes (one for students and one for chaperones), membership numbers/contact names, and purchase order (if applicable) for quick and easy admission.
- Parents driving separately must pay a parking fee of \$10 per vehicle and pay admission at the gate.
- Please note that the Zoo is cashless. We accept Visa, Mastercard, Apple Pay, or Google Pay.
 - Still have cash? No worries! We've got pre-paid debit card machines on-site, so you can swap cash for a prepaid Mastercard (and you can use the card after you leave the Zoo, too!)

 - o To avoid lines, we recommend purchasing Zoo gift cards before your visit if students will need access to funds.

Tip: Share the entry barcodes and final numbers with each teacher/bus on the trip. That way, any teacher can check in the group.

FALL AND WINTER ARRIVAL AT THE ZOO:

- You can arrive anytime after the Zoo opens until 3:30pm. Please note that Zoo hours will change throughout the year.
- Chaperones should report directly to the **main Zoo gate** for ticketing and admission.
- Exit your bus at the main gate. Proceed through EVOLV.
- Send one representative to check in at a ticket booth. At this time, final attendance numbers can be accepted. Then, create one group line to scan your ticket and enter the Zoo together.
- Buses can park in the north side parking area.
- If you need to go to your car or bus, get a stamp on your hand at the Zoo exit. You must have the appropriate stamp on your hand to re-enter the Zoo.
- Any students or staff arriving late must pay full admission at the gate.
- Lunches may be eaten in non-reserved shared spaces located inside the Zoo.

SPRING ARRIVAL AT THE ZOO:

- You will be emailed instruction at least 48 hours before the trip.
- You can arrive anytime after the Zoo opens until 3:00pm. Please note that Zoo hours will change throughout the year.
- Chaperones should report directly to the main Zoo gate for ticketing and admission.
- Zoo staff will greet the bus and ask for the representative who completed the reservation to proceed to the check-in stand. Final attendance numbers can be accepted at this time. Everyone will remain on the bus.
- Your group will proceed to the Zoombezi Bay EVOLV and admission gates.
- Buses can park in the north side parking area.
- If you need to go to your car or bus, get a stamp on your hand at the Zoo exit. You must have the appropriate stamp on your hand to re-enter the Zoo.
- Any students or staff arriving late must pay full admission at the gate.
- Lunches may be eaten in non-reserved shared spaces located inside the Zoo.

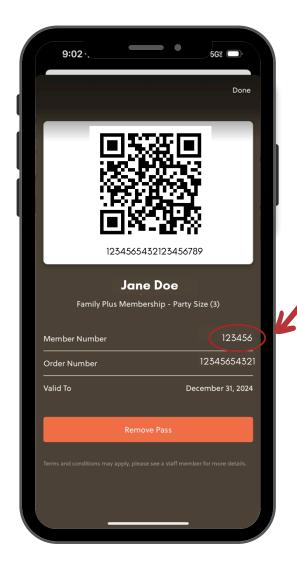




If your student's family has a Zoo membership, they are more than welcome to enter the Zoo with your group for free.

Here are a few tips which will help to make your day go smoothly:

- Parking is \$10 per vehicle.
- Upon arrival, please continue through the Evolv system.
 - Refrain from joining the students at the bus. This procedure is designed to help streamline entry and ensure a smoother flow, especially on busy days
- Chaperones will need to purchase tickets and enter through the main Zoo entrance. They can meet the group in the Adventure Cove or another location once the group enters.
- Please note, the Zoo is cashless. We accept Visa, Mastercard, Apple Pay, or Google Pay.
 - Still have cash? No worries! We've got pre-paid debit card machines on-site, so you can swap cash for a prepaid Mastercard (and you can use the card after you leave the Zoo, too!)
- Decide on a meeting place if a student gets separated from your group. If this happens, immediately contact your school group leader.
- Dress for the weather. The zoo can be about 10 degrees colder than the city of Columbus.

Your role is crucial in ensuring that students have a fun and safe learning experience. As we explore the Zoo today, please help us by staying close to your group and keeping students focused. If you notice any students becoming distracted or too excited, gently remind them to stay together and follow the guidelines so everyone can fully enjoy the day.

Your support makes a huge difference in helping us make this field trip both educational and enjoyable for all the students. Feel free to reach out to me or any staff member if you need assistance with anything!

To help ensure a fun, safe, and educational experience for all students, we encourage following the Zoo's Positive Behavior Intervention & Support (PBIS)-aligned expectations, which focus on being Respectful, Responsible, and Safe throughout the trip.

FAQS



• What should we do if our group size changes?

• When registering for your trip, we recommend overestimating the number of tickets you need. If you purchased tickets with a credit card, we can provide refunds for any unused tickets. For registrations made with a purchase order (PO), you will only be charged for the number of students who actually enter. If you need to add additional guests, please submit a separate reservation for at least 15 guests. This can follow the same reimbursement process outlined above.

. What's the procedure for canceling or rescheduling our trip?

• Email schools@columbuszoo.org, and we'll take care of it.

Do I need to assign names to each ticket? Does each student and chaperone need a valid ID to enter?

No, you do not need to assign names to these tickets. We recommend leaving the automatic fill-in as "Guest". We will
not require a valid ID for school groups to enter.

• What is the policy for late arrivals on field trip day?

• Students and staff arriving late must pay the full admission price at the gate. To receive the school group rate, the entire group must enter at the same time. Chaperones can purchase school group rate tickets at the main entrance.

• What payment options are available?

The Columbus Zoo is now cashless! We accept credit cards and purchase orders for school trips. To receive the school
group rate, please finalize and submit your attendance numbers before your visit. The discounted rate does not apply at
the gate.

How can we use a purchase order (PO)?

• You'll need to request a PO from your school. A quote worksheet is available if needed. Please overestimate the number of tickets you need, as you'll only be charged for the actual amount used.

• What is needed to use the Pre-Paid Debit Card machines?

For anyone planning to make a purchase, please remember the Zoo is now cashless. There are pre-paid debit card
machines on-site so can you swap cash for a prepaid Mastercard. To use these machines, be prepared with a working
phone number. These machines can be used by students and adults. To avoid lines, we recommend purchasing Zoo gift
cards before your visit if students will need access to funds.

• Can we reserve a picnic shelter for lunch?

• If available, you can book picnic shelters when registering for your field trip for \$50. For questions, email schools@columbuszoo.org

Where can we store our lunches?

• Lunches can be stored in the pavilion outside the main Zoo entrance (free of charge), in your rented pavilion, or carried on your person.

EVOLV



We have enhanced safety at the Zoo by adding a new EVOLV security system with advanced threat detection and screening technology. Please allow extra time for your group to pass through EVOLV screening before check-in.

- The EVOLV system will open 30 minutes before the park, unless stated otherwise.
- All guests must enter through the EVOLV system.
- Upon arrival, simply walk through the dividers. If your bag requires further inspection, a security team member will ask to check it.
- Strollers and wagons will be screened manually.
- Common items that may trigger the screening include hard glasses cases, umbrellas, and laptops.
- Bags and coolers entering the Zoo are subject to be searched at any time by security.

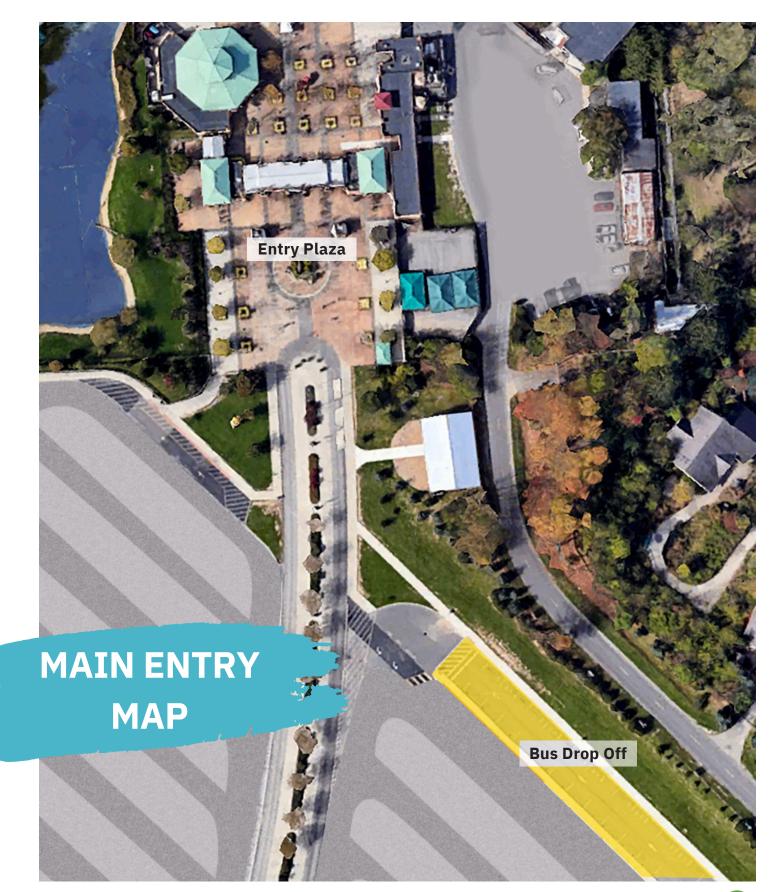
BAG POLICY

We understand your need to transport your group's lunches and are happy to help accommodate your group.

- Coolers larger than 24 inches in length when full will not be allowed in the park and may still be inspected.
- Please note that bags must be kept in a pre-booked shelter, the pavilion in the Entry Plaza, a cooler holding-area, or kept with you at all times throughout the day. Any unattended bags or coolers will be confiscated.

- We are unable to help transport lunches.

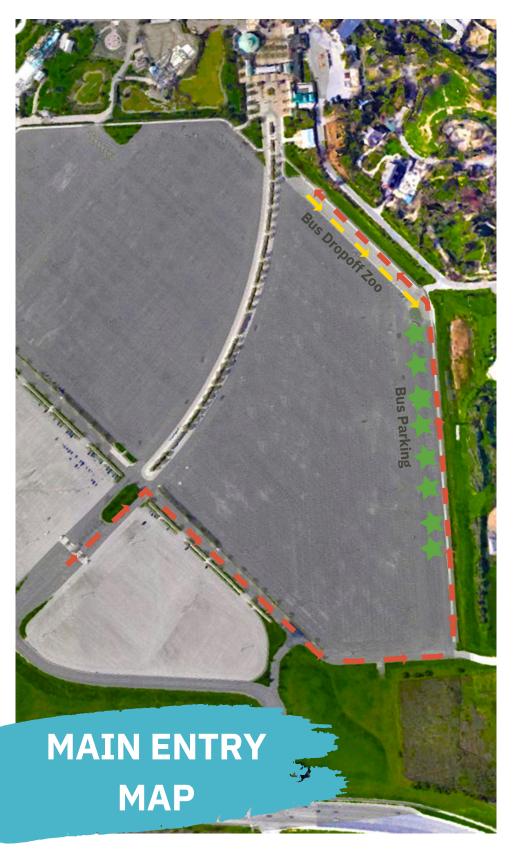
DAY OF TRIP MAP





BUS DRIVER INFORMATION



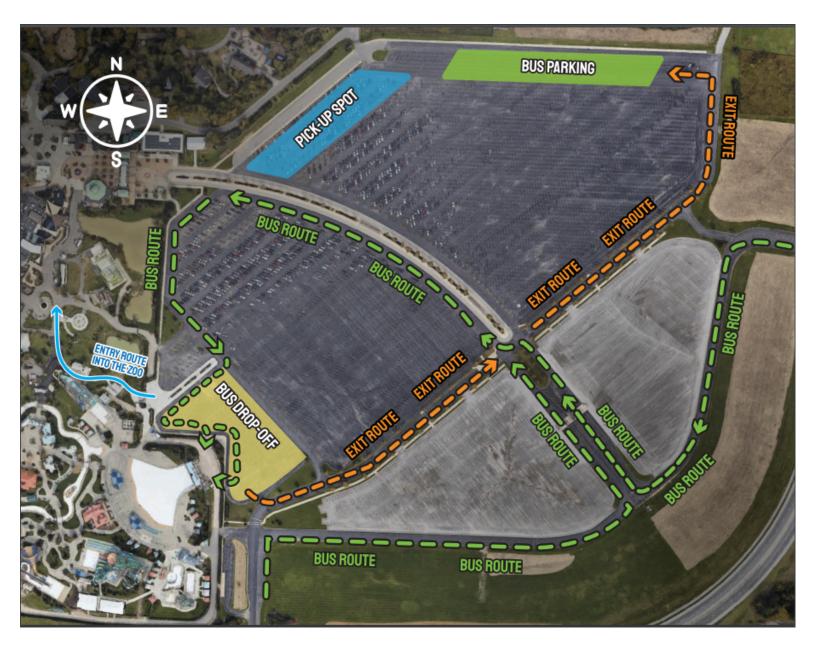


ARRIVAL AT THE ZOO:

- · Once you have passed through the parking booths, turn right at the stop sign. Follow the red arrows around the edge of the parking lot and into the bus drop off zone.
- The students will need to exit the bus in an orderly fashion and move to the sidewalk. The group should wait for everyone to get off the bus.
- Once the bus is unloaded, please follow the yellow arrows up to the Bus Parking.
- Bus parking is located where the green stars are on the map.
